### **Our Historic Hall**

While we are in the process of fixing the Village Hall due to the storms, it would be good to have a refresher on the Hall and its heritage. In the late 1890's the community realized there was a need for a community facility where people could gather, and where functions could be held. The concept of a community hall came forward and was accepted. The community in the year 1900 built the hall with volunteer labor and donated materials. When the hall was completed, OVIS was incorporated as an organization to own and operate the hall.

Over the years, the Hall has been used for many purposes with the community. The importance of the hall to the community was highlighted last year with two storms that

impacted the community and the Hall. The importance of having a meeting place for not only OVIS, but also for weddings and birthday parties and special workshops on subjects of interest to community was highlighted. It was recognized that the Hall was the heart of the community. The Hall is the oldest community structure that has been in continuous use In the County. Due to the historic nature of the structure, there are challenges with respect to the treatments needed to fix the Hall. Thank goodness, there are also waiver procedures that are available, so that the well-intended procedures are adjusted to permit the needed improvements to not only fix the hall, but also preserve its historic character.



### The Steps Taken to Obtain Funding for the Hall

With the two storms last September, there was approximately 3 feet of water within the Hall. Ironically, just two months before this event, OVIS had completed a major improvement to the Hall with a County grant. That work included painting the Hall inside and out and replacement of the floors, in accordance with historic procedures. This flooding ruined the contents of the Hall, with the result that the Hall had to be cleared out of all its fixtures, such the historic Bailey piano, all of the tables and chairs, kitchen appliances, and such. OVIS held a community event, where the contents of the Hall were removed completely. It was clear that a major improvement was needed to get the Hall back into shape for use. OVIS defined a plan for a comprehensive repair, including refurbishing the Hall floor and pursued a grant option with the County for \$80,000, with the intent that state funding would be pursued to raise the Hall several feet to put it out of harm's way. That County grant was deemed not possible by the County, since it did not meet the guidelines of that program. OVIS then realized that the only real option now was to go for the state funding, which would include not only the repair of the Hall as developed for the County grant, but also raise the Hall, so it was not as vulnerable to future flooding. OVIS made contact with State Senator Ed Hooper, who agreed to sponsor State funding as an earmark for the comprehensive improvement to the Hall, including raising its elevation. Since an earmark requires approval of both the House and Senate, a House sponsor was also needed. Representative Adam Anderson agreed to be the sponsor in the House for this proposal. That funding proposal then passed through the legislative process and was included in the final state budget. The state funding was approved for \$389,500.

OVIS is now in the process of pursuing the required permits and working through the process of the State Department for the State funding.

#### **Entering the Permit Process for the Hall**

OVIS has entered the permit process for the County to move and repair the Hall. The first step was to have an Early Assistance meeting with the various responsible county staff to identify what actions are to be taken to meet the permit requirements. That step was taken, and OVIS is working with historic preservationist consultant Paul Palmer on meeting those requirements. Also, on board to assist OVIS is the engineer Dustin Rood and the contractor Mark Roesch. These people have the expertise to accomplish the project, since it does require special knowledge. The team is currently working on developing a plan that will be followed in the coming months to get the job done. In summary, the Hall is located adjacent to a drainage way on the west side of the property. The objective is to move the hall east to the other side of the property, and then relocate the driveway to be between the drainage way and the Hall. The hall would then be elevated by 4 feet to reduce the potential of flood damage in the future. Once the Hall is relocated and elevated, the actual improvements to the Hall will be carried out. This process should take several months, and we will know better about the timing in the next few weeks.

# **State Funding for the Hall**

OVIS and the Ozona Community wish to thank our legislators from this area for shepherding through the legislative process a state funded earmark for the Village Hall. This funding is much needed to cover the cost of not only repairing the Hall due to the storm damage, but also equally important moving the Hall on the property to put it in a better position away from a drainage ditch and at the same time raising it several feet so that it is not as much at risk for future flooding.

The state money will go a long way to cover the improvement cost for this beloved community hall. Specifically, the state money is in the amount of \$389,500. This may look like a lot of money, but when you consider the significance of this project which is underway, we are keeping our fingers crossed that all the needed work can be done within that amount. Since there are some things that may not be covered by the state grant, we are keeping the donation program open until the Hall is fully repaired and functioning. All of this could not have been feasible without the support of Senator Ed Hooper and Representative Adam Anderson, who obtained this State funding.


# **Continued Thanks to HoneyDo Landscaping!**


