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OVIS Annual Meeting Set For April 24

The OVIS Annual Meeting is scheduled for April 24 at the Village Hall at 7 PM. This is referred to as the Annual Meeting because it is when the officers and board members are elected for the coming year. At this meeting, OVIS will also define the tree canopy program that is beginning to emerge as a very interesting project and very timely. Since this meeting will follow the Shore Drive bridge information meeting that the County is conducting there could be further discussion on that project by the community. County Commissioner Dave Eggers will also be in attendance to swear in the new board and to be available for any questions that people might have.

Following this meeting, OVIS will be in summer recess with no regularly scheduled meetings unless necessary. This tradition was established many years ago previous to air conditioning the Hall.

Driving Golf Carts In The Community

Ozona is it designated golf cart community. There are some rules and responsibilities that go with this designation by the County. These rules are based upon safety for all. They were developed through several community workshops in Ozona. It should be noted that golf carts are designed for the golf course and do not have safety features that are normally needed for the road. Thus, the traditional golf cart must be modified to be acceptable. In addition to that, a key rule concerns the driver of the cart. Although the golf cart looks casual and informal, it is still a highway vehicle when it is on the road, and therefore, requires a legal driver. It should be noted that law enforcement people take the approach that if a non-licensed (under age) person is cited for driving a cart, the responsibility for the traffic violation or incident is applied to the responsible adult and their license. That is where the penalty will apply.

Replacing the Tree Canopy in Ozona

The Ozona community is blessed with a large number of historic live oak trees that serve as a canopy for the roads in the community. This is one of the major amenities contributing to the character of Ozona. However, over time a number of these trees are gradually dying or being cut down for development reasons. OVIS is going on the initiative to reverse this situation by developing a tree planting program along the roadways of our community. This program is in the beginning stages now, and will be a long-term commitment by OVIS. The specifics of this program are being developed now and will be refined at the April 24 OVIS Annual Meeting.

Shore Drive Bridge Replacement

The County is doing an evaluation of the Shore Drive bridge design in Ozona with the intent of replacing it. The bridge was originally built in the 1920's and is one of the oldest bridges in the County. A public information meeting is scheduled for April 18 at the Harbor Hall in Old Palm Harbor at 1190 Georgia Avenue. The meeting is set for 5:30 to 7 PM.

The replacement is proposed to have more vertical clearance under the bridge, possibly 2 feet more. In addition, there would be a sidewalk on the south side of the bridge with that sidewalk extending to Orange Street.

Needless to say, during a significant part of this project, the bridge will not be usable for vehicular traffic and alternative routes will be needed for the people that normally use this bridge for access and egress.
