To increase the ambience of the holiday spirit, at the end of the food tables there will be choices of wine, beer, soda and of course, water. Everyone in the


community is invited to participate and to bring their friends.

Holiday Golf Cart Parade - December 11

Ozona has a long tradition of celebrating the holiday season with a golf cart parade. This will be the 16th year for this event. It should be noted that Ozona is a golf cart community. The event is set for Sunday, December 11. The parade will assemble in late afternoon by 5:30 in the post office and restaurant area on Orange Street and may be able to start moving around 6:00. In recent years, there have been over 100 golf carts participating that were decorated for the season with holiday lights and an occassional costume. People spend weeks and sometimes months, preparing their golf cart for this parade. The parade length is carefully structured to allow for the amount of time a typical golf cart can run when it is lit for the holiday season. The parade weaves through selected streets in the community where they are recognized with holiday cheers.


President's Message...

The Ozona Improvement Society (OVIS) is sponsoring the event and has obtained the necessary permit and contracted the Sheriff's Office for assistance with the traffic in the startup area. The Sherriff's Office is also participating on a ceremonial basis at the front of the parade with a 1961 Dodge Fury. Ozona residents and visitors can participate by either being in a golf cart in the parade or by residing or visiting someone who lives on the parade route.

If someone is going to participate with a golf cart in the parade, they are encouraged to be there sometime after 5:00 so they can register their cart with contact information. Awards will be made on the best decorated carts with \$25 gift certificates from Ozona restaurants. This year OVIS will be asking for a small donation (suggesting \$15) from the participants to cover the cost of the event and also to help with repairs that are needed with the Ozona Village Hall. Needless to say, the donation is optional.

Wall Springs Park Improvements

Pinellas County has several improvements planned for Wall Springs Park. This is at the Park that is just north of Ozona and Crystal Beach and can be accessed by either the Pinellas Trail or Alternate US-19.

The first improvement is to the observation tower on the island at the west part of the Park. The tower had been recently rebuilt after it had been destroyed by a fire. However, before it could be open to the public, ADA access provisions needed to be made. The project is now scheduled for the Fall of next year. This will be a major asset once the tower is made available to the public as the views of the surrounding environment are stunning.


The second set of improvements encompass expansion into the additional 150 acres that are part of the Park presently undeveloped. This is the area that is north and west of the Wai Lani Girl School Camp. These improvements will include one mile of paved trails and two miles on unpaved trails. Other improvements of a passive nature will also be included. These improvements are scheduled to begin in the Fall of 2017.

Neighborhood Watch Workshop

The Ozona community is officially enrolled in the Neighborhood Watch Program that is operated by the Sheriff's Office. There are signs throughout the community recognizing this designation.

Neighborhood Watch is a program where people in the community stay alert to anything suspicious. If they do see something suspicious, they can report it to the the Sherriff's Office.

OVIS hosts a workshop each year where a representative from the Sheriff's Office comes to the community and explains the program and how people can participate. This year's workshop was held October 25 at the Hall. Sheriff Deputy Skipper conducted the program explaining how it works and citing examples of incidents and how the Watch









Honeymoon Island State Park to get a Trail

Most everyone in Ozona knows that there is a community trail that starts at the Pinellas Trail intersection with Curlew Road, which then proceeds west along the causeway to Honeymoon Island State Park.

The Trail runs along the Dunedin Causeway, which is located on the south side of that roadway, and is used by many people to get exercise in a beautiful environment. When people reach the entrance to the Park and desire to continue their bike or pedestrian experience, they have to use the Park roads.

That will change this year. The State legislature has provided funding for a trail to continue within the State Park in a big loop connecting to various destinations within the Park. This will make it much safer for those people that are entering the Park with their bike or as a walker. Visitors will be able to be on their own safe space free of motor vehicles. So look for the changes to the Trail this coming year.



Beginning Membership and Sponsor Drive

Ozona Village Improvement Society (OVIS) functions primarily from funds obtained through membership dues and sponsorships.

OVIS membership is \$20 annually and a sponsor donation is \$100 annually. It is noted that if you are a Waste Connections of Florida (formerly Progressive Waste Solutions) customer, you will receive a discount if you have an OVIS membership.

Also, if you are an OVIS sponsor, your business card is included in the newsletter and on the community website. The membership and sponsorship run from January 1 to January 1, but OVIS began open enrollment in September to allow for the logistics of the program. It should be noted however, that membership or sponsorships actually start from the time of enrollment (there is no delayed effective date).

During the summer when the stairway on the side door of the Village Hall was being repaired, it was discovered that there was wood rot in one of the support beams under the Hall. An interim stairway was installed while OVIS developed a solution to this problem.

After OVIS went through a careful process of what needed to be done, Matthew Tierman, a general contractor, who lives in Ozona agreed to do the project. He will repair the support beam underneath the Hall and reinstall the stairway on the side door. It is expected that this work will be done before the end of the year.

The Village Hall is one of the oldest buildings in Pinellas County. It was built in 1900 with volunteer labor and donated materials.

The Hall was recently recognized by the Board of County Commissioners as a historic structure under the County's Historic Preservation Program. OVIS owns the Hall which is used not only for community functions, but is also made available on a rental basis for private events.

Holiday Golf Cart Parade Route









The Village Hall in Ozona is located on Bay Street and has served as the facility for community events over the years. The Hall is owned by the Ozona Village Improvement Society (OVIS) which uses the Hall for community events and meetings during the year.

In addition to that, OVIS does make the Hall available for rental for private events as well. While the Hall has a heritage and appearance of its vintage construction of 1900, the Hall does have the modern conveniences of central heat and air conditioning, restrooms and a kitchen area (without a stove).

Folding tables and chairs are also included in the Hall rental. The Hall rents for \$225 for a private event. If someone is an OVIS member, there is a reduced rate of \$175. If you wish to rent the Hall, the contact information is available above or on the OVIS website.
